Prepare the remote control

- 2 Insert 2 AAA batteries (not supplied) with correct polarity (+/-) as indicated.
- 3 Close the battery compartment.

Plug & Play

When you connect the unit to the power supply for the first time, or no radio station is stored in this unit, Plug and Play mode is activated to store all available radio stations automatically.

- 1 Connect the unit to the power supply.
↳ [AUTO INSTALL - PRESS PLAY, STOP CANCEL] (auto install - press the PLAY button; to cancel, press ■) displays.
- 2 Press ►|| on the main unit to start installation.
↳ [AUTO] (auto) displays.
↳ [PROG] (program) flashes.
↳ The unit automatically store radio stations with sufficient signal strength.
- 3 When all the available radio stations are stored, the first preset radio station is broadcast automatically.

✱ Tip

- If no key is pressed during Plug and Play mode, the system goes to Standby mode after timeout of 5 times. To go to installation again, press and hold ►|| for 3 seconds under Standby mode.

Toexit Plug and Play installation mode

↳ **ALB** displays on the display panel. The current album is played repeatedly. Only available for MP3 or WMA.

- Repeat all
 - ↳ **⏮** displays on the display panel. All tracks are played repeatedly.

- 2 To return to normal play, press **REP** repeatedly until the repeat mode is no longer displayed on the display panel.

Random play

- 1 Press **SHUF**.
 - ↳ **⏮** displays on the display panel: all tracks are played randomly.
- 2 To return to normal play, press **SHUF** again.



Tip

- The repeat and shuffle functions cannot be activated at the same time.

Program tracks

You can program a maximum of 40 tracks.

- 1 In DISC/USB mode, at the stop position, press **PROG** to activate the program mode.

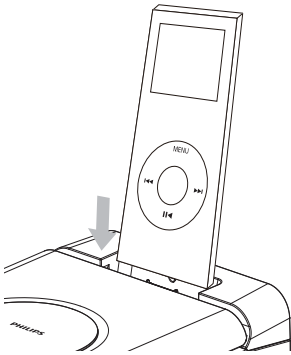

Listen to an iPod through this unit

Tune to a radio station

- 1 Press **TUN** to select FM.
- 2 Press and hold **◀▶** for more than 2 seconds.
 - ↳ [SEARCH] (search) is displayed.
 - ↳ The radio tunes to a station with strong reception automatically.

Activate and deactivate alarm timer

No power

- Ensure that the AC power plug of the unit is connected properly.
- Ensure that there is power at the AC outlet.
- As a power-saving feature, the unit switches off automatically 15 minutes after track play reaches the end and no control is operated.

No sound or poor sound

No sound or poor sound

- Adjust the volume.
- Disconnect the headphones.
- Check that the speakers are connected correctly.
- Check if the stripped speaker wires are clamped.

Left and right sound outputs reversed

- Check the speaker connections and location.

No response from the apparatus

- Disconnect and reconnect the AC power plug, then turn on the system again.

- As a power-saving feature, the system switches off automatically 15 minutes after track play reaches the end and no control is operated.

Remote control does not work

- Before you press any function button, first select the correct source with the remote control instead of the main unit.

No disc detected
