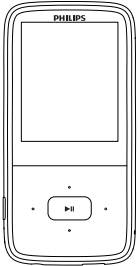
Data logging

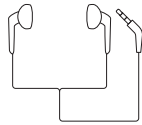

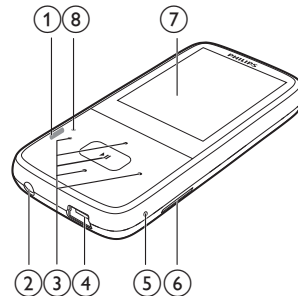

Navigate from the Home screen

Lock/unlock the buttons

During music or radio play, the buttons can be locked to prevent accidental operation.

Auto lock

After a time duration, all the buttons are locked automatically.

To set the time duration, go to  > [Keylock].

To unlock the buttons

Screen on/off

To save power, the screen switches off automatically after the pre-defined time duration if

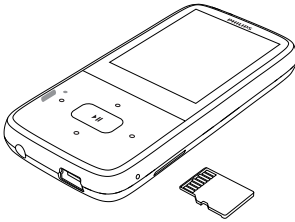

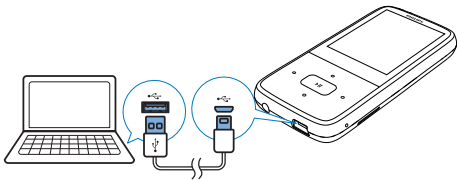

3 Get started

Charge power

LITE has a built-in battery that can be charged through the USB socket of a computer.



- Connect LITE to a PC by using the USB cable.
↳  is displayed. You enter the USB mode.

Battery level indication

- When the battery is low, the low battery screen is displayed repeatedly.
- When the charging process is complete,  is displayed.



Note

- Rechargeable batteries have a limited number of charge cycles. Battery life and number of charge cycles vary by use and settings.

To conserve battery power and increase the play time, do the following on LITE:

- Set the backlight timer to a low value (go to  > [Display Setting] > [Backlight]).

Automatic standby & shut-down

The player has an automatic standby and shut-down feature that can save battery power. In idle mode (no play, no button is pressed), the player switches off after the pre-defined time duration.

To set the time duration

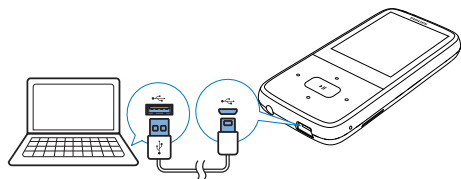
- Go to  > [Auto Off].

Switch the player on or off

Press and hold  until the player is switched on or off.

4 Music

Transfer your PC music library to the player



You can transfer media from your PC media library to **LITE** in the following way:

- Drag and drop media files in Windows Explorer.
By doing so, you can organize your media collection by file folder.

To drag and drop media files in Windows Explorer,

- 1 Connect **LITE** to a PC.
↳ You enter the transfer mode.
- 2 On the PC, under **My Computer** or **Computer**,
 - Find **LITE**;
 - Find the media files/folders.
- 3 From the PC, drag and drop media files/folders to **LITE**.

Find music on the player

On **LITE**, you can play media from the internal memory or SD card. Switch between the internal memory and SD card as needed (see 'Switch between the internal memory and SD card' on page 7).

Find music by song information

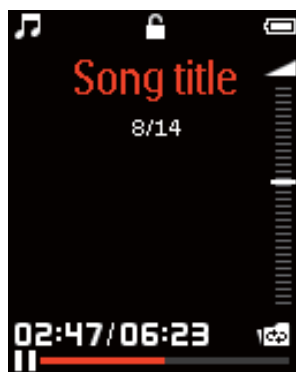
From the Home screen, go to to find music by song title (meta data or ID3 tag) in different folders.

Find music by file folder

- From the Home screen, go to to find music by file folder; or
On the music play screen, press and hold . Press / and to select **[Explorer]**. Press / / and to select your options.

Play music

- 1 Select a music file.
- 2 Press to start play.
 - ↳ Play starts from current song.

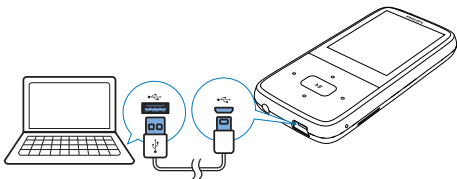
6 Video

Transfer videos to the player

Install Philips Media Converter



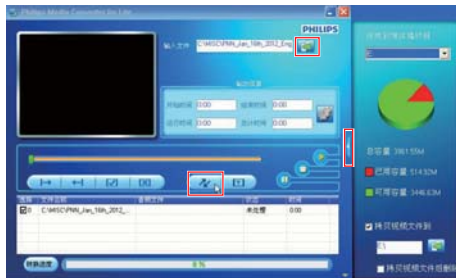

Use Philips Media Converter

With **Philips Media Converter**, you can convert the following file types into .amv:

7 FM radio

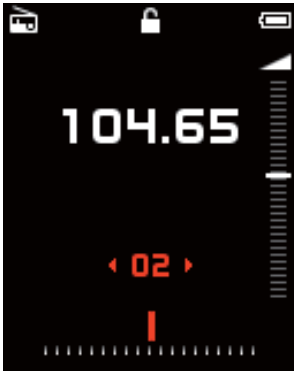
- Plug in the supplied earphones when you tune in to radio stations. The earphones double as antenna. For better reception, move the earphone cable in different directions.

Tune in to radio stations

Auto tune

The first time you tune in to the radio, start Auto search to search for stations.

- 1 In , press and hold  to select [Auto Search].
↳ Available stations are stored as presets.



- 2 On the play screen, press  /  to select a preset station.
- 3 On the play screen, press  /  to adjust the volume.

Tip

- When you move to a new place (such as a new city or country), restart auto tune for better reception.

To lock/ unlock the buttons

During radio play, the buttons can be locked automatically to prevent accidental operation (see 'Lock/unlock the buttons' on page 6).

Manual tune

Use Manual tune to search for a frequency or station.

- On the play screen, press and hold  / .
↳ You tune in to the next available station from current frequency.

Store preset stations

- 1 Tune in to a radio station.
- 2 On the radio play screen, press and hold  to select [Save Channel].
- 3 Press  to store current station as a preset.

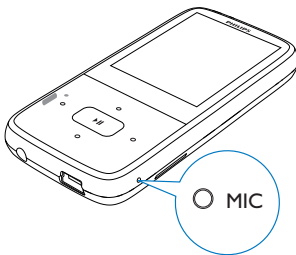
To remove current preset station

Listen to recordings

- 2 In **RECORD > VOICE**, select a recording.

9 Folder

Go to  to view and play the media files that are stored on the player.

Display settings

Backlight

The screen enters the idle mode, if no new action is taken on **LITE**. After the pre-defined time duration, the idle screen is switched off automatically. To save battery power, select a low value for the time duration.

To set the time duration

- In **[Backlight]**, select a time duration.
↳ After the selected time duration, the idle screen is switched off automatically.

To exit the power-saving mode

- Press any key.

Brightness

In **[Brightness]**, press  /  and  to select options.

REC Type

In **[REC Type]**, select the bitrate for your recordings. To reduce the file size, select the low bitrate.

System Tools

In **[System Tools]**, select your options:

- **[Delete file]**: Delete a file that you store on the player.
- **[Reset]**: Restore the player to factory settings.
- **[Format Device]**: Remove all the data that you store on the player.
- **[System Info]**: Check current firmware version.

Sleep Mode

During play or in idle mode, **LITE** can switch off automatically after a certain time duration.

In **[Sleep Mode]**, select the time duration.

Keylock

In **[Keylock]**, select a time duration. During music or radio play, all the buttons are locked after the selected time duration. In this way, accidental operation is prevented.

Memory Info

In **[Memory Info]**, check the internal memory on the player.

Storage Media

In  **[Storage Media]**, select the storage media that you access on the player: the internal memory or the SD card.

In this way, you can play the supported media files that you store on the internal memory or SD card.

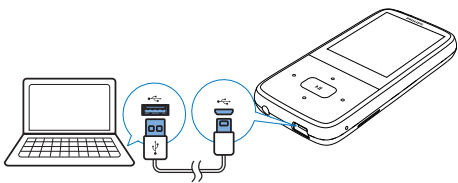
Auto off

If in idle mode (no play, no button is pressed) for a certain time duration, the player switches off automatically.

In **[Auto Off]**, select the time duration.

11 Update the firmware through Philips Device Manager

Install Philips Device Manager



- 1 Use the USB cable to connect **LITE** to a PC.
- 2 On the PC, select **My Computer** (Windows XP / Windows 2000) / **Computer** (Windows Vista / Windows 7).
- 3 Click the **Philips GoGEAR LITE** icon. Double-click the **installer.exe**.
- 4 Follow the onscreen instructions to complete the installation of the software.

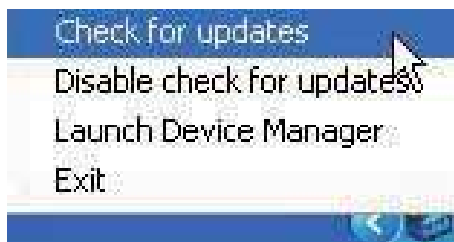

Check for firmware updates

- 1 Make sure that you have connected your PC to the Internet.
- 2 Launch **Philips Device Manager**.
↳ A dialog box is displayed.
- 3 Connect **LITE** to your PC.
↳ When the device is connected, "SA4LITXX" is displayed on the text box.
↳ You can find current firmware version of the device.



- 4 To check for firmware updates,
 - ① Close the dialog box of Philips Device Manager.
 - ② At the base of the PC screen, right click  and select Check for updates.



- ↳ **Philips SA4LITXX Device Manager** checks for updates from the Internet.

Update the firmware

- 1 When the firmware update is available, follow the onscreen instructions to download and install the firmware.

↳ **LITE** restarts after the firmware is updated and is ready for use again,

12 Troubleshooting

If **LITE** is not working properly or the display freezes, you can reset it without losing data:

How do I reset LITE?

- Insert a pen tip or other object into the reset hole on **LITE**. Hold until the player shuts down.
- If the reset option is unsuccessful, recover **LITE** through **Philips Device Manager**:

- 1 On your PC, launch **Philips Device Manager**.
- 2 Enter the recovery mode:
 - ① Switch off **LITE**.
 - ② Press and hold the volume button , and then, connect **LITE** to your PC.
 - ③ Keep holding the button until **Philips Device Manager** recognizes **LITE** and enters the recovery mode.
- 3 Start the recovery process:
 - ① On **Philips Device Manager**, click the **Repair** button. Follow the onscreen instructions to complete the recovery process.
 - ② When the recovery is completed, disconnect **LITE** from your PC.
- 4 Restart **LITE**.
